

Robert Hubsher, RCLS Executive Director National Library Legislative Day (NLLD) is **May 7-8**,

2018. Registration is open.

either in Washington DC or in nearby Virginia and Maryland with ready access to the Metro, which comes into Union Station, not far from the Liaison Hotel or the legislative office buildings



can be found on the <u>Your DC Hotels website</u>. In many cases these hotels will be less expensive.

As many of you already know the White House proposed eliminating the Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) and hundreds of millions of dollars dedicated to America's libraries through the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA).

LSTA funding is essential to New York State as these funds help to support the State Library, the Division of Library Development and the NOVELny program. NLLD is an opportunity to let our representatives know the importance and value of libraries and how essential federal funding is for New York libraries.

2018 WHCLIST Award

The White House Conference on Library and Information Services Taskforce (WHCLIST) and the ALA Washington Office are calling for nominations for the 2018 WHCLIST Award. This award is granted to a **non-librarian participant of National Library Legislative Day** (NLLD). The winner receives a stipend of \$300 and two free nights at the Liaison Hotel. This year, NLLD will be held on May 7-8 in Washington, D.C. To qualify for the award, applicants should be a library supporter (trustee, Friend, general supporter) and not a professional librarian, and first-time attendee of NLLD.

To apply for the WHCLIST award, submit a completed NLLD registration form; a letter explaining why you should receive the award; and a letter of reference from a library director, school librarian, library board chair, Friends group chair, or other library representative to:

American Libraries feature, Mar./Apr.; Library History Buff; American Libraries, Apr. 13, 2016

Greg Landgraf writes: "ALA and the American Book Publishers Council formed the National Book Committee in 1954 to fight the decline in reading. One of their ideas was a National Library Week. The concept wasn't new. At the 1922 ALA Annual Conference, the Publicity Committee had proposed a weeklong celebration of libraries. It took more than 35 years for the idea to go national, however. The NBC drew up plans for the <u>first NLW</u> to be held March 16–22, 1958."
