State Library Awards \$24 Million for Construction Projects

Mark Schaming, Deputy Commissioner for Cultural Education, has announced that the New York State Library, in partnership with New York's 23 public library systems, has awarded \$24 million in State Aid for Library Construction matching funds for 230 projects. The FY18 projects are supported by capital funds appropriated in the FY 2017/2018 State Budget for the construction and renovation of public library and public library system buildings in New York State.
