Port Jervis Free Library Installs Bicycle Service Station near Elks-Brox Park with Orange County Funding

On Friday, August 10, Representatives from Orange County Planning and Health Departments, together with the Port Jervis Free Library and Port Jervis Outdoor Club, unveiled a new public-use bicycle service station near the campground area of Elks-Brox Park. The Dero Fixit station features all of the materials needed to perform basic bike repairs and maintenance. Attached by stainless steel cables are a number of tools, including Philips and flat head screwdrivers, Allen wrenches, box wrenches, and two tire levers. Adjacent to the station is a heavy-duty air pump with a universal pump head that accommodates all valve stem types. You can change a flat tire, adjust the brakes and gears, or fix a wobbly seat. The library's bicycle service station is free for anyone to use, 24 hours a day. "We are so excited to support the Port Jervis Outdoor Club with a free Bicycle Fixit Station," said Beverly Arlequeeuw, Director of the Port Jervis Free Library. The Fixit Station is another great service the library is proud to provide to the community."

Funding to purchase the station was provided through a NYSDOH grant managed by the Orange County Health and Planning Departments titled *Creating Healthy Schools and Communities*. "This is a great catalyst for downtown businesses to support the work we are doing so close to the City," said Mike Ward, President of the Port Jervis Outdoor Club, "The installation of the first station has already sparked interest in local business owners to sponsor more stations near our almost 40 miles of new trails."
