Legislators attending the morning event included Assemblywoman Aileen Gunther and Assemblyman Karl Brabenec. Also giving their support of public libraries was Anne Barnhart, representative to Assemblyman Brian D. Miller.

Three Library Champions addressed the group on what the library means to them. They were Sheena Thompson, patron of both the Ellenville Public Library & Museum and Mamakating Library, Zoey Ketcham, a middle school student and Fallsburg Library patron and Catherine Scott, avid community volunteer and Western Sullivan Public Library Friends President.

# Adult(ish): A Meetup for 20- and 30- somethings

Valley Cottage Library is very proud of its adult librarian team of Ashley Maraffino, Katie Karkheck and Sean Antonucci for creating and developing an innovative program targeted at the 20-30 something generation of readers and potential library users. Not only were they awarded an Honorable Mention Award by the RCLS Annual Meeting Awards Committee in 2018, but they have also been selected by the NYLA Public Library Section as the winner of the 2018 PLS Section Innovative Program Award!

In 2017, "Adult(ish): A Meetup for 20- and 30-somethings" grew out of a very successful program they had been running since 2013, called the Book & Pub Club, a monthly book discussion that meets in the local bars. They wanted to bring their many enthusiastic Book and Club attendees into the physical library and attract others in this demographic who may be looking for community and engagement with their peers but aren't interested in joining a book club. Adult(ish) fit the bill! Creative programs include "game Nights," Bad Art Night, Lego Build It Night and a Throwback Halloween party.

The Member Library Youth Program of the Year Award, a framed certificate and check for \$500, was presented to Joan Rosen of the Haverstraw King's Daughters Public Library for the program "Express Your World."
