OCLC, PLA Will Partner to Respond to the Opioid Crisis

OCLC, Oct. 2

OCLC has been awarded a \$249,714 National Leadership Grant by IMLS to collect and share knowledge and resources to support

public libraries and their community partners in addressing the opioid crisis. In partnership with PLA, OCLC Research will produce eight case studies of communities in which the public library is



already playing a role in responding to the opioid crisis. The project team will also create a call-to-action white paper, host a WebJunction webinar series, and curate content and resources for library staff.

70 Years of the *Jewish News* Now Digitized

The Jewish Historical Society of New Jersey has announced the public launch of its *Jewish News* digitization project. The newspaper is available for viewing on their <u>website</u>.

This project provides online access to over 200,000 pages of the newspaper which spans 70 years. The new site is designed to provide quick and direct access to these resources for all audiences and was converted by Hudson Archival.
