Rocking the Library World

A Special Library Director's Career Journey

The Sloatsburg Public Library has often been acclaimed, by its patrons, as the best little library in Rockland County. That is largely due to the forward thinking of its Director, Annmarie McAnany. Annmarie embodies everything that a Director of Library Services should possess.

In 2004, Annmarie began her tenure at the Library as a front desk and book clerk. She expanded her role not long after, when she became the Children's Programming Coordinator. As a result of her enthusiasm and dedication to the community, children's programming and the Summer Reading Program began to grow and thrive, drawing many children and their parents to the library.

By 2014, Annmarie took over the Manager/Director position at the library and hit the ground running. At the time, Annmarie held an Associate's Degree, but dedicated time and attention to completing her Bachelor of Science Degree in December 2016, with concentrations in English, as well as Communications and Public Administration. It was during this time period that the Sloatsburg Library Board of Trustees, and the community at large, began to see the ideas and changes she was bringing to the library that were necessary to keep the library current.

In just the five years Annmarie has been in the Manager/ Director position, the library has taken on an entirely different look, both inside and out! With the introduction of Binge Boxes, a Quiet Room, the Teen/Tween Diner-themed room, reconfiguration of stacks and better lighting for optimal usage, comfortable sitting areas (including a fireplace!) throughout the library, a beautifully reorganized local history room, a multi-station computer area, and a coffee/snack bar. Annmarie has made the Sloatsburg Library a hub of the community.

In September 2019, Annmarie completed her Master of Library Science Degree through Syracuse University. The Board of Trustees of the Sloatsburg Library are so proud of Annmarie for her personal drive and dedication to education, the Library, and the community of Sloatsburg. Congratulations, Annmarie!





Maine Library Director to Hike Appalachian Trail for Funds

Ellsworth (Maine) American, Oct. 11

The Dorcas Library in Gouldsboro, Maine, has much to offer, from books to programming. Trouble is, because of insufficient funding it's open only 24 hours a week. Library Director Faith Lane (above) has an unusual plan to address this. She is planning to take an unpaid leave of absence from her job to hike the entire Appalachian Trail. Lane, who will turn 60 next year, said she remembers hikers crossing Route 2 near where she lived as a girl in Franklin County, adding that the goal of the trip is to call national attention to the library and to help it reach an ambitious fundraising goal incrementally over a period of time. She is hoping to raise \$1.25 million.
