- Noted that 2019/2020 State and Assembly aid were distributed to libraries. Libraries are encouraged to send letters to their legislators asking for aid.
- Advised continuing to write Letters to the Editors of local newspapers in support of libraries.
- Said farewell to three Trustees: Martha Anderson, Carl S. Berkowitz and Lynn Skolnick.
- Save the date: **Tuesday, February 25, 2020** for NYLA Library Advocacy Day.
- Save the date: **Friday**, **September 25**, **2020** for the RCLS Legislative Breakfast and Annual Meeting at the Bear Mountain Inn & Conference Center, Bear Mountain, NY. RCLS staff will check on discounted rates for anyone wishing to stay overnight.

## **NYLA Sustainability Initiative**

In August, NYLA Sustainability Initiative Co-Founders Rebekkah Smith Aldrich and Matthew Bollerman (pictured

right) were invited to present at the International Federation of Library Associations (IFLA) World Congress in Athens, Greece. While there, they also stopped by to pick up the Green Library Runner Up Award for the New York Library Association (NYLA) for the Sustainability Initiative. This award is administered by the Environment, Sustainability and Libraries Special



Interest Group (ENSULIB) of IFLA. The award notes NYLA's Sustainability Initiative as "...an initiative whose strengths are relevance, visibility and global impressiveness on going green. It brings out the emphasis of green libraries as practical contributors to environmental sustainability. The initiative also showed political courage." NYLA is the first United States organization to be recognized through this award program!

## NYS Library Exhibit

The December 21, 1879 edition of *The New York Herald* contained the story of Thomas Edison's invention of the

incandescent light bulb. This month, 140 years later, the New York State Library exhibits items from our collections about the inventors of lightbulbs and the harnessers of electricity: Thomas Edison, George Westinghouse, Nikola Tesla, Charles Proteus Steinmetz, and the General Electric Company. Each of these inventors, as well as GE, has a connection to New York State.
