Apply for a Game On! Grant


Games and Gaming Round Table, Jan. 2

The ALA Games and Gaming Round Table has unveiled a new annual grant program to enable libraries to develop gaming programs or collections for their communities. Through the new Game On! grants, \$500 will be awarded, either as one grant of \$500 or two grants of \$250. ALA members



currently employed at a public, school, academic, or special library in the US or Canada are eligible to apply. Libraries must illustrate a plan for a sustainable gaming program created with the funds as well as financial need and institutional support for the program. The online application is open through Sunday, March 1.

Deepfake Videos

A new technique being used to spread misinformation is called a "deepfake." Deepfake videos are altered or produced by artificial intelligencetechnologies to make based seemingly real video of something that did not really happen. Creators use different strategies such as Faceswap, which can seamlessly place someone in a place or situation they have never been in before. Lipsync merges audio and video files to make someone look like they are saying words they have never spoken. A strategy called Facial Reenactment enables creators transfer facial expressions and compose someone to look angry, happy, or any other emotion.

Library staff should be aware of this emerging trend and ready to educate their patrons on how to spot the difference between real video footage and deepfake videos.
