Public Libraries Reach Record-High Ebook/Audiobook Usage

Rakuten OverDrive, Jan. 8

Due to their creative efforts in curation, managing multiple lending models, and engaging patrons, librarians

helped drive public library circulation of digital books to record highs in 2019. Libraries and schools around the world



enabled their patrons and students to check out 326 million ebooks, audiobooks, and digital magazines in the past 12 months, a 20% increase over 2018. Publishers and authors benefited from the library's role as a valued discovery channel which resulted in record library sales of digital titles across all genres for all audiences.
